Dear FEI Customer:

This letter constitutes the third update regarding the progress of publication and market developments concerning the primary achievements of Professor Andrew J. Galambos.

TUSPCO Matters

For Pre-Subscribers, your purchase of Book One is for the limited *Deluxe First Edition* of 2,000 pre-numbered copies. It shall consist of four or, perhaps, five volumes – upwards of four thousand pages.

Volume 1 contains the V-50 lectures and three workshops, V-50X, and the Joe Pyne Interview. Also included in this volume are the Professor's live signature and the Pre-Subscribers List. Incidentally, it may interest you to know that Mrs. Cheryl Croxall Spehar, the ideological daughter of Professor Galambos, writes that the Professor told her personally of his intention to include a pre-subscribers list in Book One, "to show his gratitude for those who made a firm commitment and put their money where their mouth was . . ." Delivery of Volume 1, in any event, is scheduled for the late fall.

Volumes 2 through 4 (or 5) consist of the V-201 lectures and three workshops, and are being compiled by a separate group of editors. Each volume shall be delivered as it comes off the press.

Important Note: Volume 1 is expected to go to the typesetter in the middle of August. If you wish your name included in the Pre-Subscribers List, we must receive your Special Form by July 31st.

When the final volume is printed, a softbound edition will be published. At present, an edition of 2,000 copies is planned and will increase as the market demands. Pricing and other details will follow.

Many of you will remember Mr. Jonathan Wilkinson who ran the CCI Bookshelf and other retail operations of the Company. We are most pleased to announce his signing on full-time to run TUSPCO. His immediate tasks are organizing the inventories and producing a catalog. Concurrently, he shall be developing our web site.

And finally, we are especially delighted to inform you that selection of the next book release has been made. We would like to tell you that its identification was ours: alas, we cannot – it was the Professor's. In the course of organizing papers for various tax and legal matters, a memorandum by the Professor dated 1985, June 6 was uncovered which suggested the title, specific topics, and its publication schedule to follow on Book One.


FEI Matters

One set of master tapes is being placed in a climate-controlled, secured storage facility. A second set of masters is being prepared for digitized duplication on more durable media; we are consulting with two engineers to that end. This archiving is most critical as the tapes are deteriorating by the minute.

Over 6,000 lecture tapes have been identified and organized with a set of masters placed in climate-controlled storage. The tapes have been randomly tested and even the oldest remain in good condition. We wish to congratulate Mr. John B. Geiser, Mr. Stephen E. Gowan, Mr. Stuart L. Smith, Mr. James D. Turner and Mrs. Patricia Turner for their achievement.


Trust Matters

Professor and Mrs. Galambos established a Natural Estate Trust to hold their assets. The original trust provided that Wayne Joyner would be the successor trustee to Mrs. Galambos, and Mr. William W. Martin would be successor trustee to Wayne Joyner. Mrs. Galambos later, through the use of Professor Galambos' power-of-attorney, amended the trust to provide that Wayne Joyner and Charles Hayes succeed her as co-trustees. Mr. Martin was not named as successor trustee in the amendment.

On 1998, September 2 Mr. Martin filed suit: 1) to have the amendment declared invalid and the original trust terms reinstated; 2) for an accounting to be provided him by the trust; and 3) for his attorney fees and costs to be paid by the trust. California probate law provides that, to be valid, language must appear in both the trust document and the power-of-attorney permitting the amendment. The power-of-attorney provided for such amendments. The trust document did not. In court, the co-trustees conceded that the amendment did not comply with California probate law. Mr. Martin's other demands were denied by the judge.

As a result of this, Wayne Joyner remains as the sole trustee and Mr. Martin as his successor. Charles Hayes remains as accountant for the trust and president of The Universal Corporation and its subsidiary The Universal Scientific Publications Company, Inc.

Dear FEI Customer:

Response to our announcement of the publication of Book One, Volume One has been significant. Many, including non-subscribers, have expressed an interest in purchasing additional copies of Book One in both the deluxe hard-bound First Edition and the soft-bound Second Edition, both which will be available at the upcoming open house on 1999, April 17. Because of this response, we wish to make this **special offer for both editions of Book One:**

Deluxe First Edition

1. The First Edition of Book One, pre-numbered with a signature by Professor Galambos and with the Pre-Subscribers List, is limited to 2,000 copies. Of the 500 remaining copies available for sale, 200 are being released for sale at this time.
2. Except for reserved copy numbers disclosed in section 4 below, prices for additional copies are as follows:
 - a) The first 50 copies will be sold at \$2,000 ea.
 - b) The next 50 copies will be sold at \$2,250 ea.
